Morning Routines

Children should arrive between 8:35am and 8:45am. They will complete a morning activity to settle them ready for the day. This may be times tables, handwriting, spellings etc.

PE

- ◀ PE lessons are on Wednesday and Thursday.
- ◀ Indoor PE - Wednesday
- ◀ Outdoor PE - Thursday
- ◀ Please ensure that children have a PE kit in school at all times containing clothing relevant to the weather. Tracksuit bottoms and a jumper are essential during the winter months as we will be going outside for PE whatever the weather.
- ◀ Children will need a pair of named trainers in their PE kit bag at all times.
- ◀ No jewellery allowed during PE lessons. Children either need to come into school without jewellery or be able to remove them themselves.

School Bags

- ◀ Small school bag for their spelling book, reading record, lunchbox (if relevant), one healthy snack and water bottle.
- ◀ Please do not send in any personal items from home such as toys or pencil cases, all resources will be provided for the children.
- ◀ Please ensure that your child has a change of outdoor shoes (wellies/trainers) and a waterproof jacket in school everyday, a fold away pack-a-mac that can stay in their locker all year would be ideal.
- ◀ Please ensure that all clothing is **clearly named**.

Home Learning

In Year 3, it is expected that children:

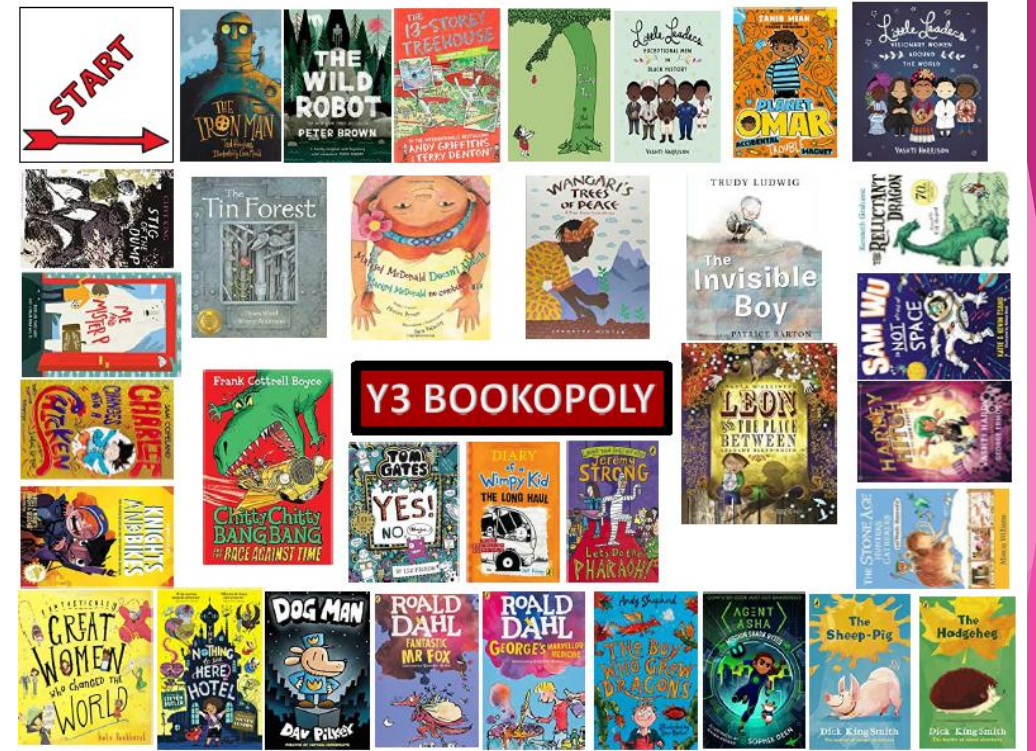
- ◀ Read daily. Every child will bring home a reading book. Please log all reading on BoomReader.
- ◀ Practise times tables - We will have a times tables test on a **Tuesday**. We start with recapping the 2,5 and 10 from KS1 and move onto the 3,4 and 8
- ◀ Spellings on Spelling Shed or in their spelling books (spellings will be set on a **Tuesday** for testing the following **Tuesday**)

How to help at home

- ◀ Encourage speaking and listening skills.
- ◀ Share lots of books and encourage children to read daily.
- ◀ Let your child see you reading, writing and doing maths - can they help you with a shopping list and work out the change for something you buy?
- ◀ Spelling - common exception words from the Year 3 and 4 spelling lists.
- ◀ Practise recognising and writing numbers to 100 and recalling number bonds.

Bookopoly is a reading for pleasure system we use in KS2.

When children are at a certain reading level, they will be able to play bookopoly. Children choose a book from the bookopoly trolley, take it home to read and return it when finished with a completed book review sheet. The idea is to see how many books children can read throughout the year,

- ↯ Consider plastic free zero waste alternatives for lunch box items...
- ↯ Please keep lunches nut free

Forest School



Forest School is an exciting, outdoor, child-led experience that builds confidence, curiosity, and a deep connection with nature. Sessions take place all year round on our beautiful site, Wildwood. Here, our children are encouraged to explore, build, discover, play freely, taking supported risks.

Forest School helps develop children's resilience, independence, teamwork, and problem-solving skills through hands-on activities such as den building, fire lighting, woodwork, and nature crafts. Children are given the freedom to follow their interests, spark their imagination, and learn new things at their own pace away from the classroom environment. Skills are nurtured and developed over a six-year Forest School journey at Wildmoor.

Children learn to observe the changing seasons, care for living things and improve their knowledge and understanding of plants and animals. They truly connect with the natural world around them. Each session is a new adventure!

Key Information

- Sessions led by forest school & first aid trained staff Mrs Guy, Mr Jackson, with class TA
- 5x two-hour sessions (class split in to am and pm group)
- Takes place in nearly all weather - waterproofs must be in school
- Children's arms and legs and arms should be fully covered to take part
- Communication about dates nearer the time (always a Thursday)
- Forest school agreement to be signed in advance (shared before sessions start)
- The children's experiences of sessions within one day (am and pm group) may vary as content often depends on the ideas and interests of the group
- Sometimes sessions involve food cooked on the fire we check allergies and dietary requirements on school records ahead of these sessions. Please let us know if there are any changes. Thank you!
