RAAC

You may have seen recent media coverage regarding Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete (RAAC) and its use in educational settings. RAAC is a lightweight form of concrete; because it is weaker than regular concrete, concerns have been raised about its long-term durability. The Department for Education (DfE) has recently changed its guidance to education settings on the management of RAAC.

We are pleased to inform you that we are not affected by this decision as we do not have RAAC in our building and therefore they will continue to function as normal.

Safeguarding and Child Protection

Safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children is defined as:

- 1. Protecting children from maltreatment;
- 2. Preventing the impairment of children's mental and physical health or development;
- 3. Ensuring that children grow up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care:
- 4. Taking action to enable all children to have the best outcomes.

At Wildmoor Heath School, all staff maintain a culture of vigilance and put the health and safety, learning progress and pastoral needs of our learners first. We have robust safeguarding procedures in place, including annual formal training for all plus ongoing informal updates. Wildmoor Heath has four trained DSLs who receive multi-agency training, attend ongoing formative sessions and represent the school at Child Protection meetings.

Mrs Vincent is the Designated Safety Leader (DSL), supported by Mrs MacManus, Mrs Joseph and Mrs Thurgood as our Deputy Designated Safety Leaders (DDSLs).
