Safeguarding and Child Protection

Safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children is defined as:

- 1. Protecting children from maltreatment;
- 2. Preventing the impairment of children's mental and physical health or development;
- 3. Ensuring that children grow up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care;
- 4. Taking action to enable all children to have the best outcomes.

At Wildmoor Heath School, all staff maintain a culture of vigilance and put the health and safety, learning progress and pastoral needs of our learners first. We have robust safeguarding procedures in place, including annual formal training for all staff

Wildmoor Heath have three trained DSLs who receive multi-agency training, attend ongoing formative sessions and represent the school at Child Protection meetings. Mrs Vincent is the Designated Safety Leader (DSL), supported by Mrs MacManus and Mrs Joseph as our Deputy Designated Safety Leaders (DDSLs).

At Wildmoor Heath, we believe in the importance of being active, learning, connecting, giving and taking notice. These are the 5 ways to wellbeing. This month's wellbeing challenge is going to focus on being active. We know that exercise and being active has enormous benefits for our health and happiness. It can boost our confidence, help us manage stress, help us sleep and think better too – improving how well our brain functions. There are lots of simple ways to become more active each day – you can walk, run, dance, swim, cycle or do some yoga. The list is almost endless and it can make a difference to how we feel every day.

Our wonderful PE Leader, Mrs Rich, has kindly volunteered to demonstrate a series of yoga poses that you can learn at home. We have a different pose for each week of October. We hope you enjoy this challenge – please let us know how you get on!

Chairs Report 2022/23

This is my second year as Chair for Wildmoor Heath PTA. This year has been one of significant investment in the school, after our efforts in 2021/22. This year saw the installation of new outdoor play equipment, at a total cost of over £12,000. The children have enjoyed playing and using this equipment, and everyone within the PTA should feel extremely proud of the work they dedicated to raise such a significant amount, and the impact it has had for all the children at Wildmoor Heath School.

On top of this, 2022/23 saw the PTA support the purchase of 15 iPads. These will be used by all the school year groups, but importantly for Year 4 students who practice their times tables daily on them in preparation for their national assessment in June each year.

Further funding went into the school grounds. With a huge amount of hard work from parent and PTA volunteers we helped with the upkeep of the school grounds. We invested in paint, a new outdoor blackboard, as well as a new sign at the front of the school. The overnight impact to the grounds was huge, and we could not have done this without the help of our volunteers.

We also built, installed, and filled our Wildmoor Heath Book Shack. This ensures that all children always have access to a variety of books, complimenting the already very strong literacy curriculum that the school drives. The book shack also enhances the look of the front of the school, with its beach but style, and is used daily by children.

Combined, this is an investment of £17,938.53 into the school over the last year. This would not have been possible without the strong support of our parents. I would like to spend a special thank you to the PTA members, and to Mat, parent and owner of Forrest Roofing and Carpentry who installed our book shack, fitted a much better roof, flooring and built all the bookshelves inside.

I would also like to take the opportunity to thank local and national businesses that have supported us throughout this academic year with sponsorship or donations. With these, we are able to run large events that we know will make a significant profit, and not put PTA funds at risk. Our Christmas laser light show, and summer fair received significant sponsorship from Hall Hunter Farm, Hat and Home Estate Agents, Zzoomm, Pinewood Football Club, Frank Schipper Estate Agents and Beehive after school club.

Without the support of these businesses, we would not have been able to achieve the level of funding we have this year. We would also like to thank HP Inc for their money match, which resulted in £2,855.57 of additional funding over the last year.

This year sees a change in leadership team at the school, with Clare Vincent becoming Headteacher and Colette MacManus becoming Acting Deputy head and PTA lead. On behalf of the entire PTA team, I would like to thank you for your immediate collaboration and support. While we continue to discuss and align where PTA funds should be invested during this coming academic year, some of the initial suggestions include funding shaded areas on the field for the hotter months, funding chrome books and science equipment.

This year also sees changes to our committee. I would like to say a huge thank you from everyone to Andrea Winks and Charlotte Vaughan. Andrea and Charlotte have been our treasurer and secretary over the last year, and without them our success of last year would not have happened. They have dedicated a huge number of hours to the PTA, and while we are sad to see them step down from the committee, we are pleased that they keep their support and ideas as they remain as active members of the PTA.

We would also like to thank Sarah McKernan for her leadership with 2^{nd} hand uniform over the last few years. Last year this raised £399.53 for the PTA. Sarah has now handed this responsibility back to the PTA, and this year we hope we will see our online uniform shop go live. We would also like to thank Charlotte Williams for leading on our Bags 2 School collections, which last year raised £539.20. We have now installed a clothing bank, meaning parents can donate clothes at any time.

With change, brings opportunity, and we have already seen that new fundraisers are gaining better traction and momentum within our community. This year, I hope we can continue that, and bring together creative ideas for different fundraisers that continue to drive significant funding into the school for all the children to benefit from. Our recent Wonka bar fundraiser is testament to this.

Finally, thank you to everyone who has supported, attended or volunteered for an event. We cannot achieve any of this without your support. Together we have made a huge difference to the journey our children have through Wildmoor Heath School, and we look forward to seeing you all at our events and meetings in 2023/24.
