

Year 5 had an amazing fire safety talk from some of the crew at Crowthorne Fire Station. We discussed everything to do with fire, from what can cause a fire to how to stay safe and prevent one. Some lucky Year 5 children were able to try on the clothing and gear, which was extremely heavy.





Year 5 went to Winchester Planetarium and had the most cosmic time! Our day started off with a Rocket workshop where the children designed their own rockets; they were launched and we learnt from our mistakes, resulting in a second chance to make our rockets more streamlined. We finished the day looking at the other science exhibits.





Year 6


In PE, we have been practising hockey skills of control whilst dribbling, using open and reverse dribbling techniques. We also worked on our spatial awareness, looking up to see a clear space to move into or to dribble away from an approaching defender.

In Design & Technology, we had a welcome relief in the midst of mock SATS to have been making beanbags in the design of a rainforest animal, most of us taking the example of a poison dart frog. We started by practising 3 different stitches (running stitch, back stitch and over stitch) and then evaluated these and decided that back stitch was most appropriate to ensure the lentils stay inside the beanbag. We then cut out our design from felt and stitched the front and back together, ready to fill with lentils. Thank you to Mrs Doyle for coming in to help us with the sewing.
