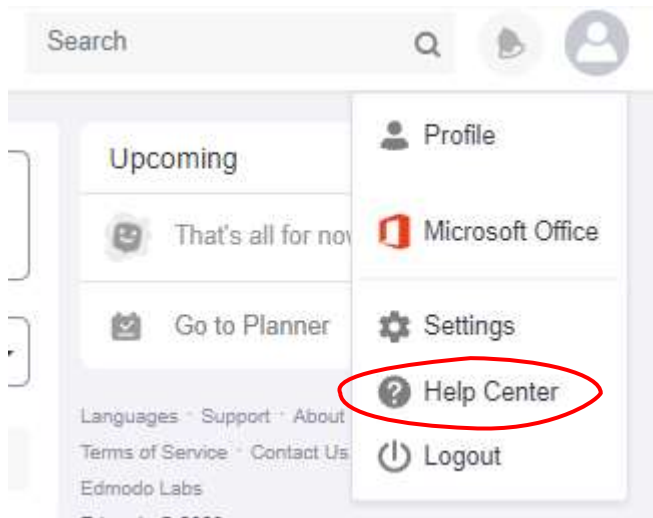


# Parent and Student Quick How to Guide for Edmodo

Welcome to Edmodo!

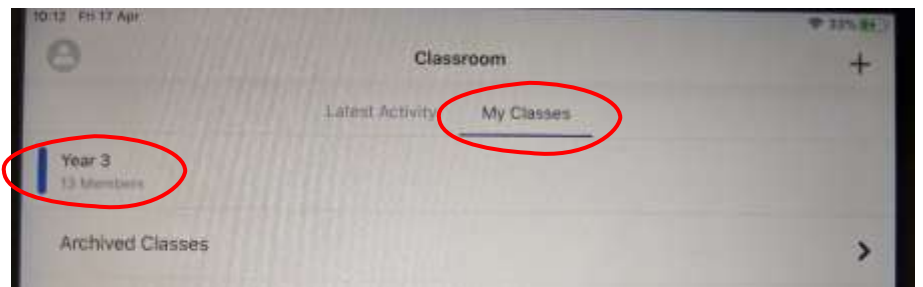
You can find an extensive help section in Edmodo if you click on your name and then click on "Help Centre".



Here are the essentials to get you started.

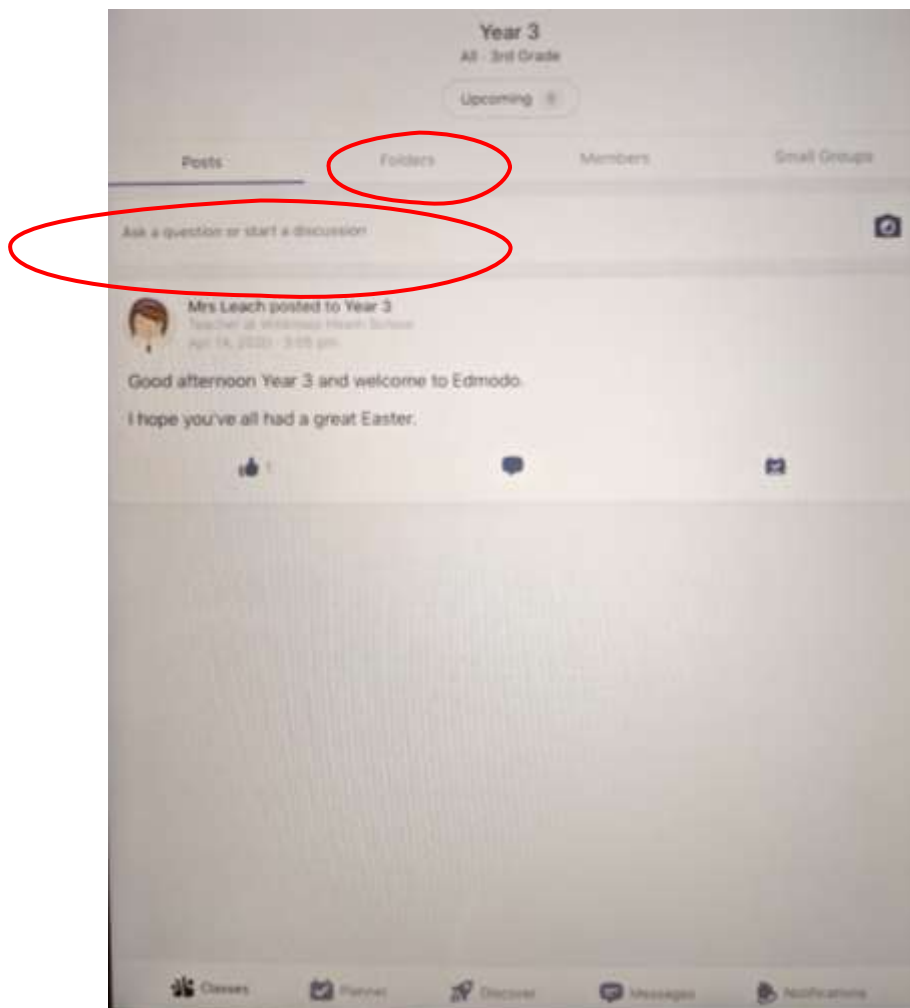
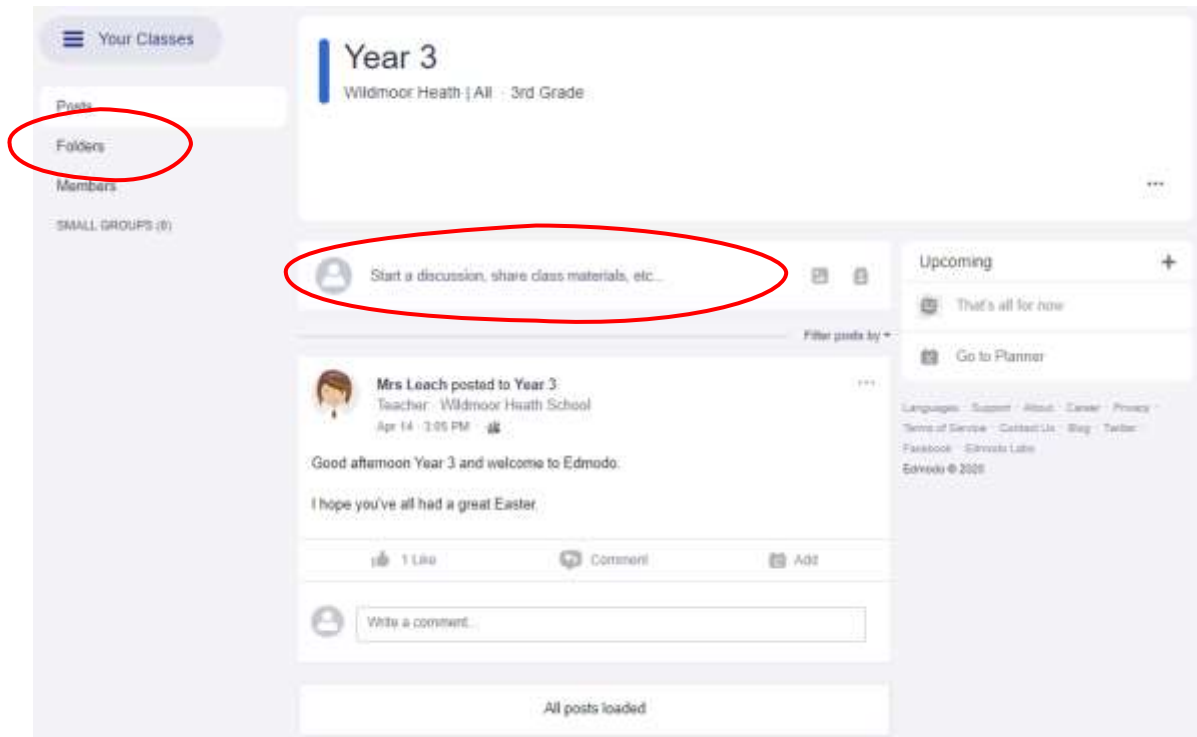
## Getting to your class page

First, you need to click on your class. You can find this on the left-hand side on a computer or at the top if you are logging in on the app.

## Class page



Once you have clicked on your class page you can access everything you need to complete your home learning.

You may see a post from your teacher showing where to find your home learning or it may give you specific instructions.

You can then access all the files you need in the “Folders” section.

This can be found down the left-hand side on the computer or on the top on the app.

You are also able to post a piece of work that you have completed for marking or start a conversation about work with the rest of the class. All you need to do is click on “Ask a question or start a discussion”, type your post and attach any files.


The rest of the class and your teacher can then respond to your post.

## Parent and Student Quick How to Guide for Edmodo

### Folders

Once you click on “Folders”, you will see your home learning folder where everything will be kept. Keep on clicking through the folder system until you find the correct piece of home learning.

Inside this folder, you will find all the documents and links to various websites that you need to complete your home learning.

Once you have completed your work, you will need to hand it in. Your teaching will give you further instructions on where to put your completed home learning. They may ask you to post it on the class wall (see section ‘Class page’) or they may ask you to send it as a private message (see section ‘Messages’).

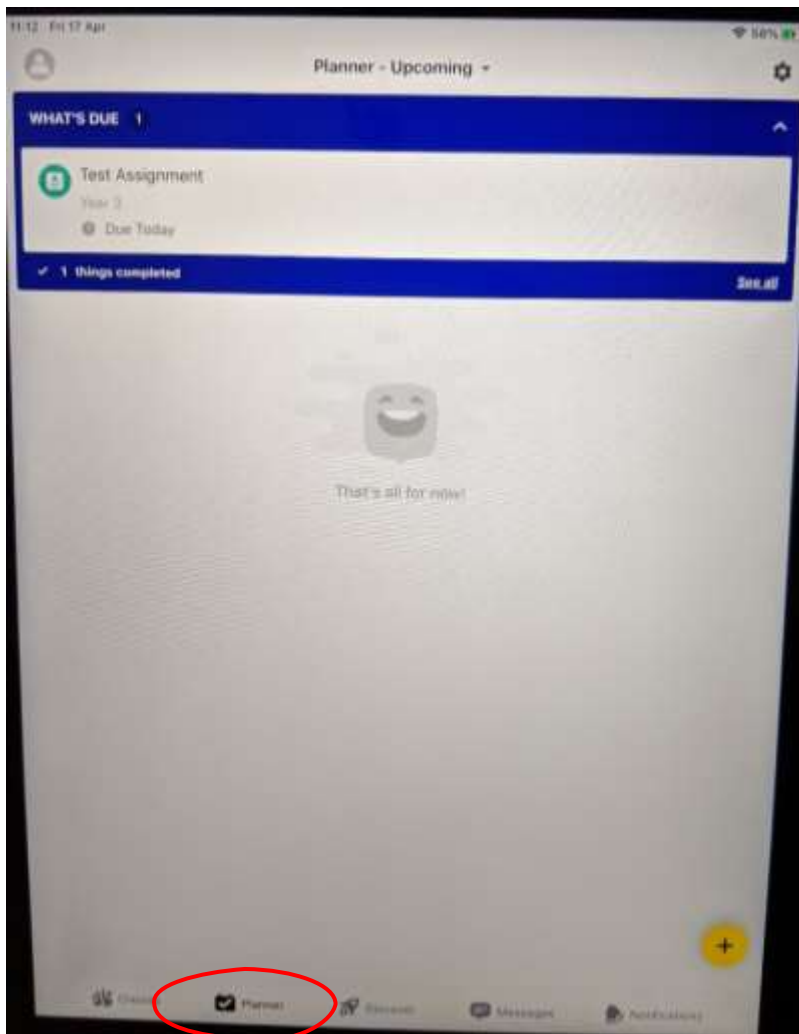
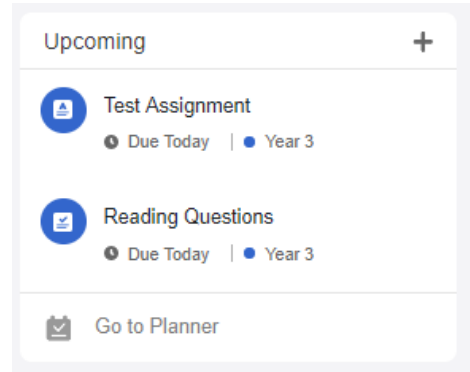

You may also be given an assignment or a quiz to complete directly on Edmodo.

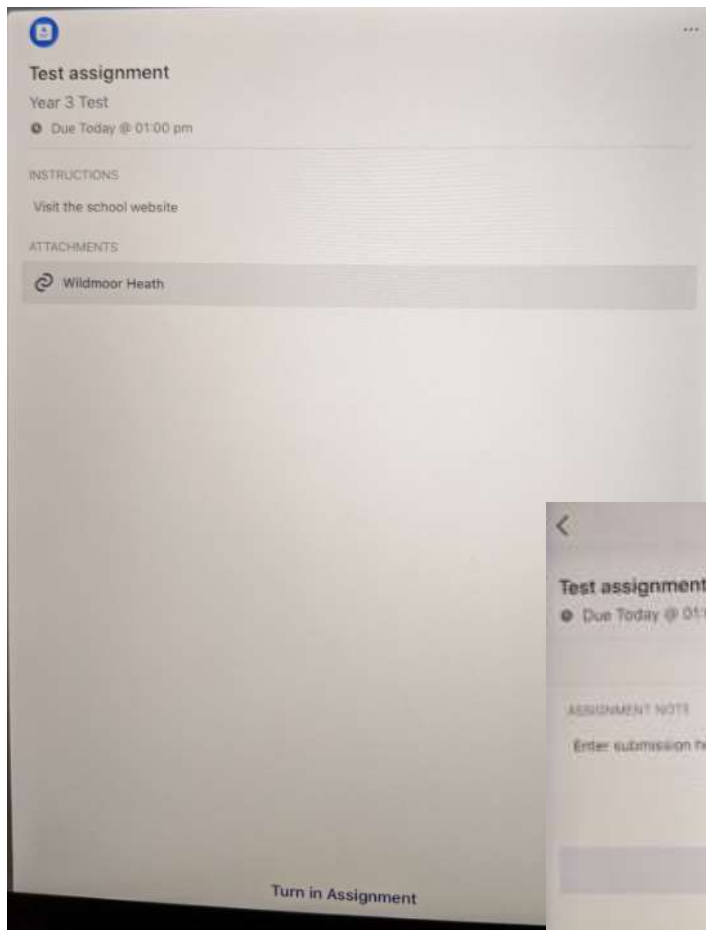
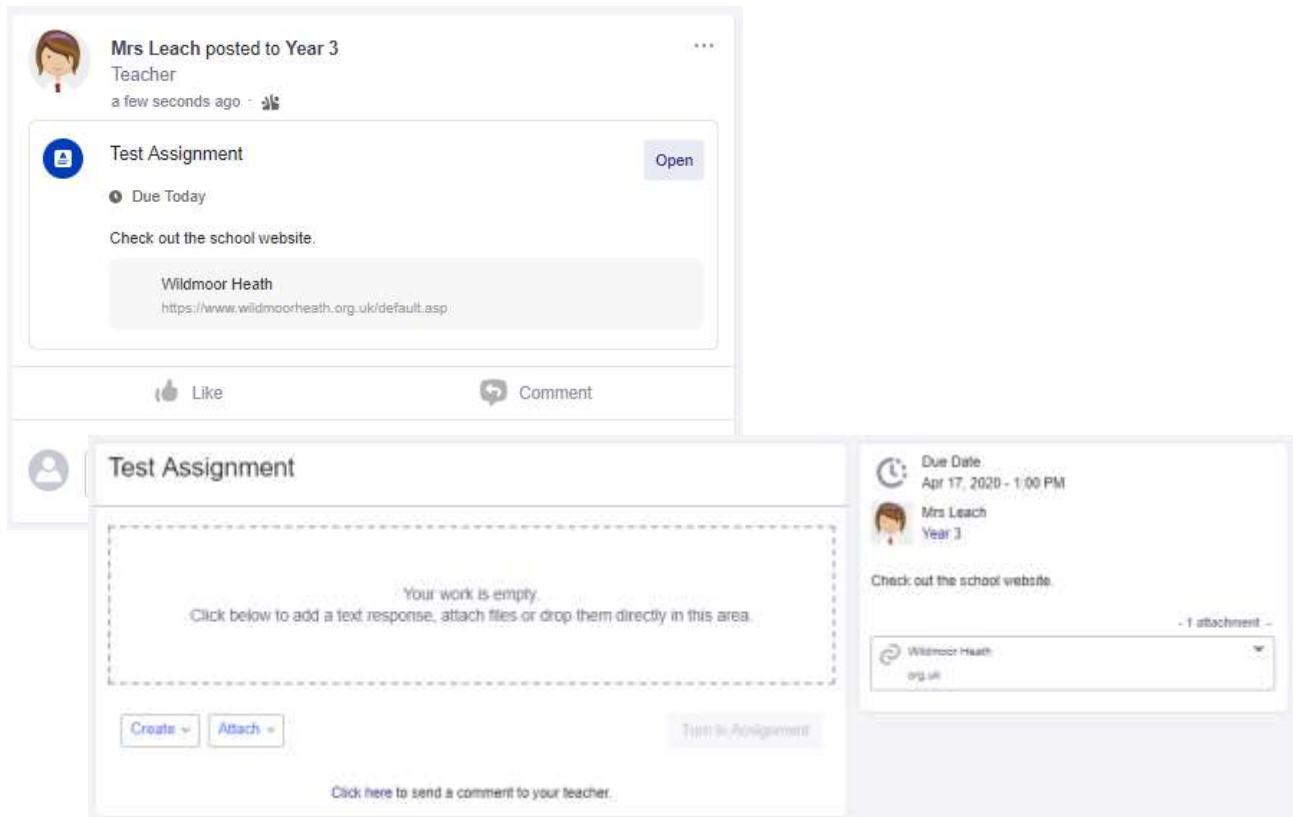
This will appear in various different places including on the class feed.

## Assignment

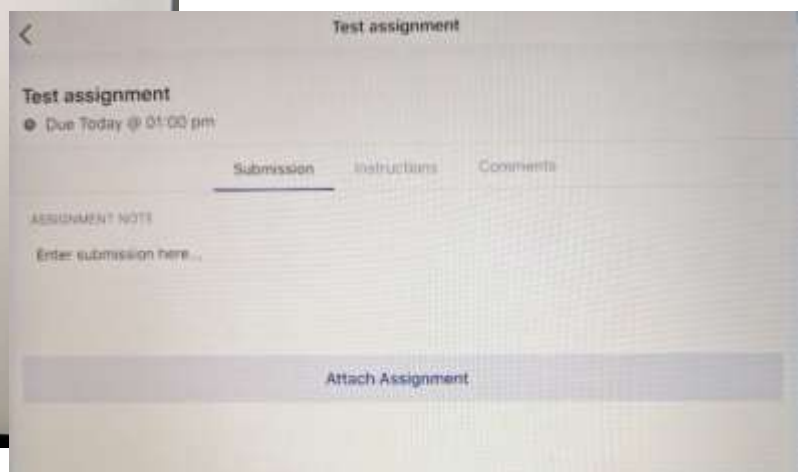


When you have an assignment, you can view or complete the task which has been set.

Once you are happy, you can Submit your work.



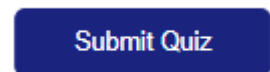

## Quiz

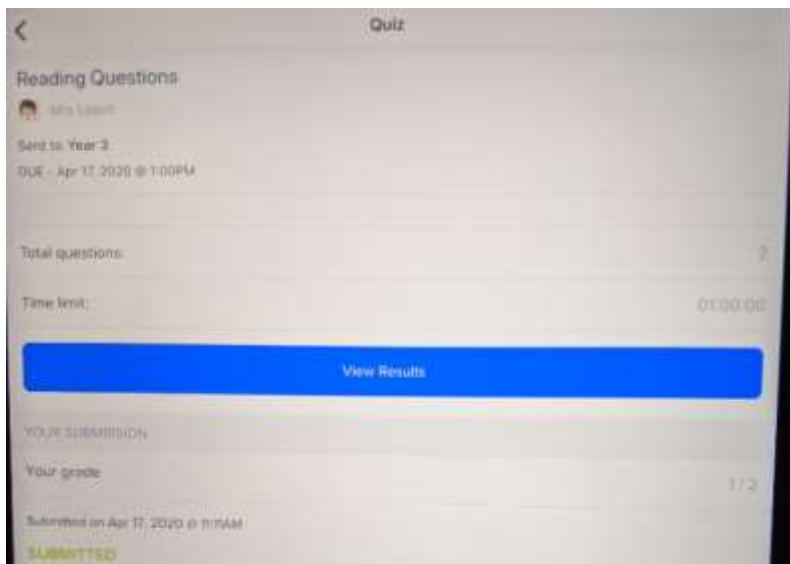

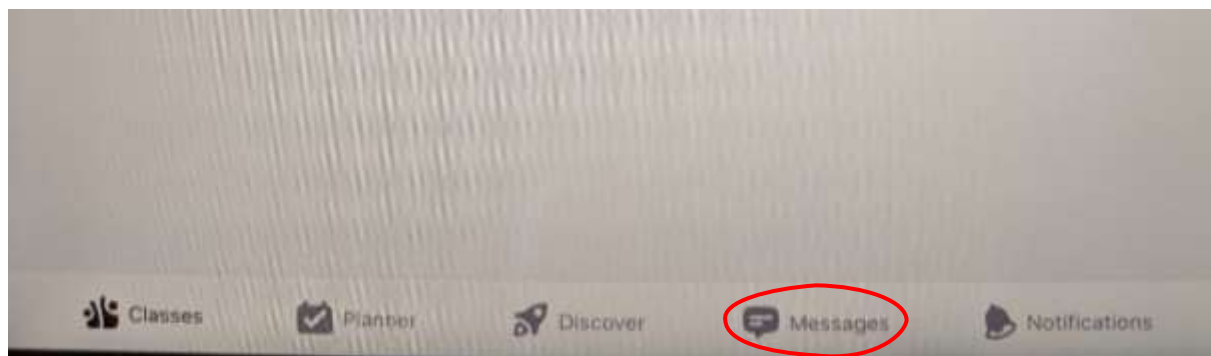
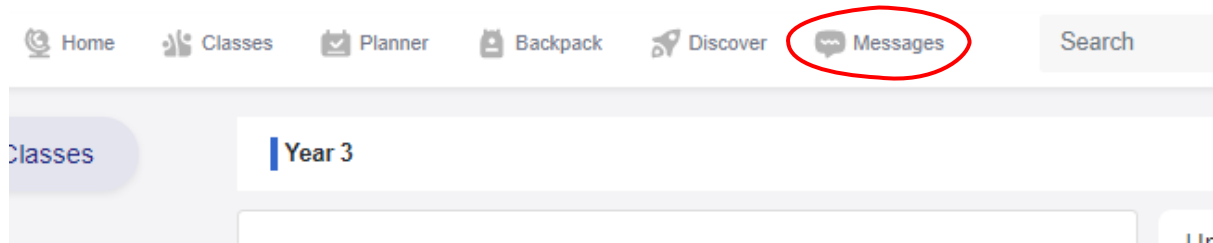

## Messages

If you find that you need to talk to the teacher without everybody else seeing it, you can send a private message to your teacher.

To do this you will need to find the “Messages” button. You can find this along the top on a computer or at the bottom on the app.



Click on the  button to start a conversation.

Choose who you want to send the message to.

Type your message and include any files you want to send.

Once you have finished, click “Send”.

This will then be a private conversation between student and teacher like you would have on your phone.

You may be asked to submit your home learning using the private messages. Please check with your teacher.
